

Central Institute of Freshwater Aquaculture, Bhubaneswar





Indian Institute of Water Management, Bhubaneswar

On Day-6 of the on-going Swachhta Pakhwada i.e., on 21st December 2025, a *Swachhta drive* involving farmers and farmwomen were organized in *Parichanrapada* village of Nimapada block in Puri district, Odisha. At the outset, the participants were administered swachhta pledge and then sensitized about different aspects of *Swachh Bharat Abhiyan* such as benefits of cleanliness and hygiene on health and village environment. Community Outreach Programme on Cleanliness and Sanitation

A community outreach initiative was conducted at Sunday Haat, Chouldary, centered around the theme "Cleanliness and Sanitation Drive". This programme actively engaged the village community, including vendors, shoppers, and local volunteers, to advocate for hygienic practices in public market areas. Significant attention was directed towards the necessity of cleanliness in marketplaces, which are frequented by many and significantly impact public health. The significance of washing vegetables with clean water, avoiding contact with contaminated surfaces, proper food storage, and covering food items was underscored. Fish vendors received guidance on maintaining clean surfaces, utilizing fresh water for washing, and ensuring hygienic handling to avert contamination. The programme successfully fostered awareness within the community and reinforced the concept that a clean market contributes to enhanced health, safer food options, and an overall improved quality of life for everyone.
