

Dear colleague,

Ayurveda Day, vide Resolution published in Gazette of India, Extra ordinary Part I dated 01st June, 2017 is officially celebrated every year on the auspicious day of 'Dhanwantari Jayanti - *Dhanteras*' since 2016. This year, it falls on 10th November, 2023. Since last three years, with the initiatives taken by PMO, it is being celebrated as the program of Government of India with a whole of Government approach.

In the recently concluded G20 Summit, all the Member States unanimously adopted the G20 declaration which recognized and acknowledged the potential of evidence based Traditional Medicine Practices in Public Health Delivery Systems. The Declaration emphasized on 'One Health' approach while addressing various health aspects including nutrition.

In alignment with the cognizance of G20 on Traditional Medicine and the theme of India's G20 Presidency, '**Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam**' the focal theme for Ayurveda Day-2023 has been decided as '**Ayurveda for One Health**' with Tag line '**Ayurveda for every one on every day**' i.e. 'हर दिन हर किसी के लिए आयुर्वेद' - focusing on human-animal-plant-environment interface.

The notion of 'One Health' is not new, it refers to the ancient times when *Acharya Charaka* had proclaimed the phenomena of "**universe-individual continuum**" i.e., '**universe within oneself and individual within universe**' and the influence it has on balancing the *people-planet ecosystem*. Ayurveda is not just the traditional system of medicine, it is the way of life, which addresses wellbeing of non living things like environment, rivers, soil, weather etc., as well as all living beings including Human, Animals, Aquatic life and plants. The Ayurveda advocacy has included thousands of edible herbs, which are easily accessible in forests or in rural area depending on the Geo-climatic variation. Many of the dietary practices followed in tribal pockets have high nutritional value and are cost effective but are not known to urban population. Ayurveda in the form of ethno- medicine is commonly used in veterinary practices in rural India. The National Medicinal Plants Board under Ministry of Ayush has developed cultivation techniques of more than 110 plant varieties which have high market demand.
