Subject: Review of preparations for 'Har Ghar Tiranga' programme [Hoisting/ Display of National Flag in Households from 13th to 15th August, 2022].

Cabinet Secretary chaired a meeting of Committee of Secretaries on the above subject on 18th July, 2022 at 5pm in the Committee Room, Rashtrapati Bhavan, in hybrid mode.

- 2. At the outset, Cabinet Secretary, observed that *Har Ghar Tiranga* is a major initiative under Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav (AKAM) and entails mobilization of the entire Government machinery for its successful outcome. It is, therefore, imperative that all Ministries/ Departments engage closely with M/o Culture to ensure that the objectives of 'Har Ghar Tiranga' are fully achieved. Cabinet Secretary further noted that generating mass awareness, provisioning of adequate numbers of flags and encouraging citizens to procure and hoist them in their households were key for success of the initiative. He solicited the whole hearted participation of all Ministries/ Departments in this important programme.
- 3. Secretary, M/o Culture made a presentation on the subject (*Annexure*), outlining the objectives of *Har Ghar Tiranga*, key enablers and the execution strategy including addressing the demand and supply of Flags. He further outlined the three procurement options available *viz.* through GeM Portal, through M/o Culture and through local procurement (SHGs, local vendors etc.). Secretary, Culture informed that sufficient vendors, onboarded on GeM portal, have capabilities to provide flags of all sizes on credit basis (the normal GeM credit cycle of 30 days). In addition, Flags can also be sourced from e-Commerce portals. He also mentioned the indicative prices of various sizes of Flags.
- 4. He also emphasized the need of generating momentum through special outreach activities for success of the *Har Ghar Tiranga* programme. He further informed that the *Har Ghar Tiranga* media campaign would be officially launched through a VVIP tweet on 22nd July, 2022 followed by the national launch of 'Har Ghar Tiranga' Anthem (*Sankalp Geet*) on 2nd August, 2022. 500 celebrities have been roped in for publicity of *Har Ghar Tiranga* in order to generate enthusiasm and elicit peoples' involvement on a mass scale. Secretary, Culture requested Secretaries to fully mobilize their institutional resources including that of their institutions in States, in order to ensure widespread awareness and the effective implementation of *Har Ghar Tiranga* campaign. In this direction, leveraging the organizational network of Ministries/ Departments including the CPSEs, Attached Offices, Autonomous Bodies etc. under their administrative control was emphasized.
- 5. Secretary, Culture further elaborated the indicative Action Points for various Ministries/ Departments. He also requested that Ministries/ Departments may encourage their CPSEs and related Industry Associations to assist the States in outreach campaigns and supply of Flags.
- 6. Secretaries/ Representatives informed that they have already sensitized their employees, State institutions and CPSEs on the *Har Ghar Tiranga* initiative and assured that they would contribute fully to the programme's success, from effective publicity to timely procurement and distribution of Flags. Cabinet Secretary observed that M/o Coal, M/o Steel,

M/o Mines etc. may mobilize their industrial/ mining townships as a whole. He further observed that D/o School Education & Literacy and D/o Higher Education may sensitize their students to in turn mobilize their parents/ families to observe *Har Ghar Tiranga* from 13-15th August, 2022. Cabinet Secretary also observed that M/o Home Affairs may issue appropriate Advisories relating to *Har Ghar Tiranga* including on handling/ disposal of Flags after the programme and guidance on lowering the Flag after sunset, etc.

- After detailed deliberations, the following recommendations were made:
 - All Ministries/ Departments may adopt a 'Whole of Government' approach and engage closely with M/o Culture to ensure that the objectives of Har Ghar Tiranga are fully achieved.
 - ii. Ministries/ Departments to generate momentum through special outreach activities, fully leveraging their institutional machinery and their reach in States to make it a people-centric movement, with maximum Jan Bhagidari.
 - iii. Ministries/ Departments may encourage their CPSEs and related Industry Associations/ Corporate Sector to help in procurement and distribution of flags.
 - iv. All Ministries/ Departments may hold meetings and finalize their respective Action Plans for implementing *Har Ghar Tiranga* programme, on priority. It must be ensured that National Flags are made available to all employees for purchase.
 - v. M/o Culture may obtain Har Ghar Tiranga Action Plans from all Ministries/ Departments and closely follow up on the progress made on the identified action points.
 - vi. M/o Home Affairs may issue appropriate Advisories relating to the observance of Har Ghar Tiranga including on handling/ disposal of Flags after the event, lowering the National Flag after sunset, etc.
 - vii. M/o Information & Broadcasting may ensure wide resonance of the Har Ghar Tiranga programme and related activities, across all media platforms.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to all participants.





Dea Dr. Minapera:

Kindly refer to my previous communication wherein it was informed that 'Har Ghar Tiranga' campaign has been launched under the aegis of 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav' (AKAM) to encourage citizens to hoist the National Flag of India in their homes. Under the campaign, it is envisaged that all citizens shall be encouraged to hoist Tiranga at their homes during the Independence week from 13th - 15th August, 2022. As you are aware, 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav' (AKAM) is being celebrated to commemorate the 75 glorious years of a progressive Independent India. Under the aegis of AKAM, a campaign 'Har Ghar Tiranga' has been launched to encourage the citizens to hoist the National Flag of India in their homes. The display/hoisting/use of the Indian National Flag is governed by the Flag Code of India, 2002 and the Prevention of Insults to National Honour Act, 1971.

- 2. The Flag Code of India, 2002 was amended vide Order dated 30th December, 2021 and paragraph 1.2 of Part-I of the Flag Code of India, 2002 shall now be read as under:-
 - 1.2. "The National Flag shall be made of hand spun and hand woven or machine made, cotton/polyester/wool/silk khadi bunting."
- 3. The Flag Code of India, 2002 has been further amended vide Order dated 20th July, 2022 and clause (xi) of paragraph 2.2 of Part-II of the Flag Code of India, 2002 shall now be read as under:-
 - (xi) "where the Flag is displayed in open or displayed on the house of a member of public, it may be flown day and night;"
- 4. I am enclosing the salient features of the Flag Code of India, 2002 including changes made therein on 30th December, 2021 & 20th July, 2022. FAQs about the use/display of the Indian National Flag are also enclosed. You are requested to ensure that these are widely disseminated among various organisations/PSUs under your administrative control.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) about the Indian National Flag

Q1. Is the use, display and hoisting of the National Flag guided by any overarching set of instructions?

Yes- the 'Flag Code of India 2002' and the Prevention of Insults to National Honour Act, 1971.

Q2. What is the Flag Code of India?

The Flag Code of India brings together all laws, conventions, practices, and instructions for the display of the National Flag. It governs the display of the National Flag by Private, Public, and Government Institutions. The Flag Code of India took effect on 26th January 2002.

Q3. Which material can be used to produce the National Flag?

The Flag Code of India, 2002 was amended vide Order dated 30th December, 2021 and National Flag made of polyester or machine made Flag have been allowed. Now, the National Flag shall be made of handspun and handwoven or machine-made, cotton/polyester/wool/silk/khadi bunting.

Q4. What is the appropriate size and ratio of the National Flag?

As per paragraph 1.3 & 1.4 of the Flag Code of India, the National Flag shall be rectangular in shape. The Flag can be of any size but the ratio of the length to the height (width) of the National Flag shall be 3:2.

Q5. Can I display the National Flag at my home?

As per paragraph 2.2 of the Flag Code of India, a member of the public, a private organization, or an educational institution may hoist/display the National Flag on all days or occasions in accordance with the dignity and honour of the National Flag.

- The National Flag shall not be displayed or fastened in any manner as may damage it
- The National Flag should not be flown from a single masthead (top part of a flagpole) simultaneously with any other flag or flags
- The National Flag shall not be used to cover a speaker's desk, nor shall it be draped over a speaker's platform
- The National Flag shall not be used as a portion of costume or uniform or accessory of any description which is worn below the waist of any person nor shall it be embroidered or printed on cushions, handkerchiefs, napkins, undergarments or any dress material

Q9. Are there any rules for prevention of insult to the Indian National Flag?

Yes. In accordance with explanation 4 to section 2 of "the Prevention of Insults to National Honour Act, 1971', the following should be observed:

- The National Flag shall not be used as a form of drapery in any form whatsoever, including private funerals
- The National Flag shall not be used as a portion of costume or uniform or accessory of any description which is worn below the waist of any person nor shall it be embroidered or printed on cushions, handkerchiefs, napkins, undergarments or any dress material
- There shall be no lettering upon the National Flag
- The National Flag shall not be used to wrap, receive, or deliver things
- The National Flag shall not be used to cover the sides, back, and top of any vehicle.

- Prime Minister
- Cabinet Ministers, Minister of State, and Deputy Ministers of the Union
- Chief Minister and Cabinet Minister of a State or Union Territory
- Speaker of the Lok Sabha, Deputy Chairman of Rajya Sabha, Deputy Speaker of Lok Sabha, Chairman of Legislative Councils in States, Speakers of the Legislative Assemblies in States and Union Territories, Deputy Chairman of Legislative Council in States, Deputy Speakers of Legislative Assemblies in States and Union Territories
- Chief Justice of India
- Judges of Supreme Court
- Chief Justice of High Courts
- Judges of High Courts

Q13. How can we display the Indian National Flag along with flags of other nations?

- As per paragraph 3.32 of the Flag Code of India, when the National Flag is displayed in a straight line with flags of other countries, the National Flag shall be on the extreme right. The flags of other nations will follow in an alphabetical order as per the English versions of names of the nations.
- If the flags are flown in a closed circle formation, the National Flag is flown first and is followed by flags of other national in a clockwise manner.
- When the flag is displayed against the wall with another flag from crossed staffs, the National Flag shall be on the right and its staff will be in front of the staff of the other flag.

Salient Features of Flag Code of India, 2002

- 1. The Indian National Flag represents the hopes and aspirations of the people of India. It is the symbol of our national pride and there is universal affection and respect for, and loyalty to, the National Flag. It occupies a unique and special place in the emotions and psyche of the people of India.
- 2. The hoisting/use/display of the Indian National Flag is governed by the Prevention of Insults to National Honour Act, 1971 and the Flag Code of India, 2002. Some of salient features of the Flag Code of India, 2002 are listed below for the information of the public:
 - a) The Flag Code of India, 2002 was amended vide Order dated 30st December, 2021 and National Flag made of polyester or machine made Flag have been allowed. Now, the National Flag shall be made of hand spun and hand woven or machine made, cotton/polyester/wool/silk khadi bunting.
 - b) A member of public, a private organization or an educational institution may hoist/display the National Flag on all days and occasions, ceremonial or otherwise, consistent with the dignity and honour of the National Flag.
 - c) The Flag Code of India, 2002 was amended vide Order dated 19th July, 2022 and clause (xi) of paragraph 2.2 of Part-II of the Flag Code of India was replaced by the following clause:-
 - (xi) "where the Flag is displayed in open or displayed on the house of a member of public, it may be flown day and night;"
 - d) The National Flag shall be rectangular in shape. The Flag can be of any size but the ratio of the length to the height (width) of the Flag shall be 3:2.
 - e) Whenever the National Flag is displayed, it should occupy the position of honour and should be distinctly placed.
 - f) A damaged or dishevelled Flag shall not be displayed.

Dear Chief Executive.

As you would be aware that the Government has approved the programme of 'Har Ghar Tiranga' under the aegis of the Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav (AKAM). The central theme of the programme is to inspire every Indian to hoist the National Flag at their home and invoke the feeling of patriotism in the hearts of the citizen and promote awareness about our National Flag.

The Committee of Secretaries headed by Cabinet Secretary reviewed the preparations of the programme (Hoisting/Display of National Flag in Households from 13th to 15th August, 2022) in the meeting held on 18th July, 2022 and has inter alia made following recommendations in this regard.

(i) All Ministries/Department may adopt a 'Whole of Government' approach and engage closely with M/o Culture to ensure that the objectives of Har Ghar Tiranga are fully achieved.

(ii) Ministries/Department to generate momentum through special outreach activities, fully leveraging their institutional machinery and their reach in States to make it a people-centric movement, with maximum Jan Bhagidari.

(iii) Ministries/Department may encourage their CPSEs and related Industry Associations/Corporate Sector to help in procurement and distribution of flags.

(iv) All Ministries/Departments may hold meetings and finalize their respective Action Plans for implementing Har Ghar Tiranga programme, on priority. It must be ensured that National Flags are made available to all employees for

(v) M/o Culture may obtain Har Ghar Tiranga Action Plans from all Ministries/Departments and closely follow up on the progress made on the

identified action points.

It is accordingly requested that all CPSEs may draw up their action plan for promoting 'Har Ghar Tiranga' programme as per the above and share the same with their concerned Administrative Ministry/Department. DPE vide letter dated 19th July, 2022 has already requested all CPSEs for procuring their requirements of National Flags. It may also be ensured that instructions contained in the Flag Code of India are duly followed in this regard.
