Subject: Identification of office records for appraisal and transfer to National Archives of India.

Dear Dr. Mohapatra,

As you are aware that the National Archives of India (NAI) is charged with the task of keeping, conserving and making accessible to users the non-current records of the Government of India. In this regard, I wish to draw your kind attention to clause (c) of the sub-section (1) of Section 6 of the Public Records Act, 1993, to be read with Rule 5 of the Public Records Rules, 1997 that envisages "appraisal of Public Records which are more than twenty five years old in consultation with the National Archives of India,....with a view to retaining the public records of permanent value and transfer of these records to National Archives of India". Further, sub-rule (2) of Rule 9 of the said Rules also states that "no public record which is more than twenty five years old shall be destroyed by any records creating agency unless it is appraised."

The last instance when your organization transferred the public records after appraisal was in 1948 wherein the records up to year 1945 were deposited with NAI. Needless to mention, as per statute, to ensure the longevity of records and to facilitate research in the public sphere, this process of appraisal and transfer should be a regular ongoing process.

Therefore, I would request you to kindly instruct the designated officials in your organisation to review and assess the quantum of records that are more than twenty five years old and to inform NAI about the requirement for the appraisal of records. Based on your information, we shall depute a team to appraise records twenty five years old and older; subsequently, these documents would need to be transferred to NAI for preservation, safekeeping and management.

I look forward to your support in strengthening the record management practices in Government of India and the efforts towards the long term preservation of records of enduring value. I shall be grateful for an early response in this regard.
