Central Institute of Freshwater Aquaculture, Bhubaneswar







Indian Institute of Spices Research, Kozhikode



ICAR-NIHSAD observed Swachhta Pakhwada-2025 from 17th to 31st December 2025, in accordance with the guidelines issued by ICAR and in alignment with the spirit of the Swachh Bharat Mission. The observance aimed at promoting cleanliness, hygiene, environmental sustainability, and community participation as integral components of institutional culture.

The Swachhta Pakhwada commenced with a **Swachhta Awareness Day**, where emphasis was laid on moving beyond routine waste disposal towards **sustainable waste management and behavioural change**. An interactive lecture and discussion sensitized scientists, officers, staff, and contractual personnel on the long-term health and environmental benefits of cleanliness.

At the institutional level, several **internal cleanliness and efficiency-enhancing activities** were undertaken. These included systematic **weeding out of obsolete records**, segregation and identification of scrap materials, strengthening of **e-Office and digitalization practices**, review of housekeeping services, and cleanliness drives across office spaces, laboratories, and common areas. These efforts not only improved hygiene but also contributed to better organization and workplace efficiency.

A major highlight of Swachhta Pakhwada was the strong focus on **community outreach and public participation**. Cleanliness drives, awareness rallies, and Shramdaan activities were organized in nearby residential colonies, schools, Anganwadi centres, villages, and public spaces. Students, women groups, rural youth, local residents, and sanitation workers actively participated, reinforcing the message that cleanliness is a shared social responsibility.

Special attention was given to **environmental sustainability initiatives**, including campaigns on **discouraging single-use plastics**, **plastic waste management**, **water conservation and recycling**, and **plantation drives**. Awareness sessions on microplastics, household-level composting, and alternatives to plastic helped translate knowledge into practical action at the community level. Activities conducted at schools and Anganwadi centres under the "Catch Them Young" initiative played a crucial role in inculcating cleanliness habits among children from an early age.


National Bureau of Agriculturally Important Microorganisms, Mau
